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24	Amend the bill by inserting after the title and before the enacting clause the following:
26	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
28	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
30	Whereas, it is important that this legislation be enacted immediately so there will be local representation on the
32	conversion committee in the event there is an opportunity to sell or lease the Pineland Center; and
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36	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately

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42	Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:

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Sec. 2. P&SL 1995, c. 79, §3 is amended:

18 Sec. 3. Committee establishment; membership; appointment. The committee Pineland Conversion Committee is established in-section 20 17-subsection-3 and consists of 5 9 members, - appointed - by - the Gevernor,-te and serve until such time as the Governor appoints 22 members to the Pineland Development Authority pursuant to section 13 or all interests in the state property have been conveyed. A 24 committee member's term does not extend beyond 2 years from the effective date of this Act. Immediately after appointment, the 26 member shall assume that member's duties. Any vacancy must be filled for the unexpired term by the Governor. Three-members-are 28 A quorum consists of 5 members. A majority of those members present and voting is required for the committee to take action 30 as long as at-least one member voting in favor of any committee action is either-the-chair-of-or-a-member-of-the-Governor's-Task 32 Force-on-Pincland Center - Reuse-or the chair and 2 members voting in favor of any committee action are representative 34 representatives appointed by the municipal officers of the Town of New Gloucester. A vacancy in the committee does not impair 36 the right of committee members to exercise all rights and perform all the duties of the committee. The Governor may remove a 38 member from the committee for misconduct.

 A committee member is not entitled to receive compensation for services but is entitled to receive reimbursement for
necessary expenditures, including travel expenses incurred in carrying out these services. A committee member is not an
employee of the State or its agencies.

 46 The committee shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local
48 government matters on February 1, 1999 on the status of the committee's efforts to sell Pineland Center.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.'

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Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

This bill requires four municipalities to appoint members to 8 serve on the Pineland Conversion Committee. If the timing of these appointments necessitates a special meeting for one or more 10 of these municipalities, then this bill necessitates additional expenditures by a local unit of government. Any additional costs 12 that may be required of these municipalities will be these insignificant. In order for the State to require 14 municipalities to appoint members to the committee, the State must fund 90% of the additional local costs as required by the 16 Constitution of Maine. No additional funding is included for the potential costs that may be incurred by these municipalities.

The additional costs associated with reporting to the 20 Legislature on the committee's efforts to sell Pineland Center can be absorbed by the Department of Administrative and Financial 22 Services utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

This amendment removes all provisions in the bill pertaining to the Pineland Development Authority and adds revisions to the Pineland Conversion Committee and its membership. It also adds an emergency preamble and clause and a fiscal note to the bill.
