SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to S.P. 739, L.D. 2017, Bill, "An Act to Provide Access to Veterinary Education for Maine Students"

Amend the bill in section 1 by striking out all of subsection 1 and inserting in its place the following:

'1. Positions. The Access to Medical Education Program is 22 established under this section. Under this program, the chief executive officer shall secure up to 20 21 positions annually for 24 Maine students at schools of allopathic er, osteopathic or veterinary medical education up to an aggregate of 80 <u>84</u> Five positions are for students of osteopathic 26 positions. medicine and, 15 positions are for students of allopathic 28 medicine and one position is for students of veterinary medicine. If there is an insufficient number of qualified 30 applicants for positions in either discipline allopathic or osteopathic medicine, the chief executive officer may increase or 32 decrease the number of positions available in either discipline. The allopathic and osteopathic medicine positions are available 34 only to eligible students commencing professional education on or after January 1, 1993. The veterinary medicine position is available to a student commencing medical education on or after 36 January 1, 1999.'

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 1 the 40 following:
