SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report. It replaces the bill and makes the Act a resolve. It establishes the Lobster Conservation Zone Study Committee to examine the current lobster zone management structure as well as the concept of subzones within that existing structure. The committee must report its findings and recommendations by January 15, 1999.
