24	Amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated "§3316." in subsection 4 in paragraph B in the 4th line from the end (page 2, line 47 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "12 months"
26	and inserting in its place the following: '180 days'
28	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

32	FISCAL NOTE
34	This bill may increase Other Special Revenue to the Department of Corrections by minor amounts as a result of federal
36	reimbursement for certain costs associated with an out-of-home placement.'

40	SUMMARY
42	This amendment requires that within 180 days from the time a
44	youth is voluntarily placed outside the youth's home the court must make an initial determination that reasonable efforts have been made to prevent or eliminate the need for out-of-home
46	placement. Changing the time of initial review from 12 months to 180 days is consistent with federal law.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
