This amendment amends the definition of antique auto. It also adds to the motor vehicle laws a definition of "motorized wheelchair." It provides an exemption to the requirement that vehicle operators turn off fog lights and auxiliary lights when approaching or following another if the lights are installed at the time of manufacture. It also prohibits a person from parking a vehicle on a limited-access highway, on a traffic lane, deceleration lane, acceleration lane, or on a bridge or on the left shoulder of the traffic lanes.
