Sec. 7. Effective date. Those sections of this Act that amend the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 5106, subsections 14 and 15 and Title 26, section 1411-D, subsections 8 and 9, and that enact Title 22, section 5106, subsection 16 and Title 26, section 1411-D, subsection 10 take effect January 1, 1999.

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SUMMARY

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This bill consolidates the administration of home health services in the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Elder and Adult Services. The bill also directs the bureau to establish a standard reimbursement rate for personal care assistance services.

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
