Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §1312, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 584, 4 §1, is amended to read:

б 4. Especially trained guide dog trainer; access to facilities; responsibilities. An especially trained guide dog trainer, while engaged in the actual training process 8 and activities of guide dogs, shall--have has the same rights, 10 privileges and responsibilities described in this section with respect to access to-public-facilities and use as are applicable to a blind, visually handicapped or otherwise physically disabled 12 person.

SUMMARY

This bill provides guide dog trainers, while engaged in training a guide dog, all rights of access and use as are provided to a blind, visually handicapped or otherwise physically

disabled person who uses a guide dog.
