
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SENATE AMENDMENT "D" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P.
784, L.D. 2111, Bill, "An Act to Reauthorize the Toxics and
Hazardous Waste Reduction Laws"

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Amend the amendment in section 4 in subsection 16 in the 3rd
line (page 1, line 36 in amendment) by striking out the
following: "~~pursuant to the SARA, Title III, Section 313, and
listed~~" and inserting in its place the following: 'pursuant to
the SARA, Title III, Section 313, and listed'

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Further amend the amendment in section 15 in paragraph B in
subparagraph (1) in division (h) in the 2nd line (page 8, line 6
in amendment) by inserting after the following: "wastes" the
following: ', broken motor vehicle batteries, transformers'

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SUMMARY

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This amendment restores a reference to the Superfund
Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986 that was stricken in
the committee amendment. The amendment also exempts from the
hazardous waste requirements one-time cleanups of broken motor
vehicle batteries and transformers if the cleanup is approved for
an exemption by the Commissioner of Environmental Protection.
