Three members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, 2 at least one belonging to the political party holding the largest number of seats in the House of Representatives and at least one belonging to the political party holding the 2nd largest number of seats in the House of Representatives. One member of the House of Representatives appointed must serve on the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources matters and one member of the House of Representatives must serve on the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over utility and energy matters; and
- H. Four members of the general public with a knowledge of and interest in the management of radioactive materials and radioactive waste, 2 of whom are appointed by the Governor, one of whom is appointed by the President of the Senate and one of whom is appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives: and
- I. One member representing an environmental advocacy organization, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 32 The terms of the legislative members expire the first Wednesday in December of even-numbered years. The terms of the public 34 member appointed by the President of the Senate, one public appointed by the Governor and the licensee 36 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives expire December 31, 1997 and every 2 years thereafter. The terms of the 38 public member appointed by the Speaker of the House Representatives, the licensee member appointed by the President 40 of the Senate and one public member appointed by the Governor expire December 31, 1996 and every 2 years thereafter. This bill includes an Other Special Revenue allocation of \$25,000 in fiscal year 1998-99 for the Department of Environmental Protection to provide staff support to the Advisory Commission on Radioactive Waste and Decommissioning, including authority to establish one part-time position by financial order.

The Other Special Revenue to support this allocation will be generated through an assessment of \$25,000 annually on the Maine Yankee Atomic Power Plant.'

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SUMMARY

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This amendment is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources. It requires that at least one, rather than 2, of the 3 Senators appointed to the Advisory Commission on Radioactive Waste and Decommissioning belong to the political party holding the largest number of seats in the Senate and at least one of the Senators belong to the political party holding the 2nd largest number of seats in the Senate, and that at least one, rather than 2, of the 3 Representatives appointed Advisory Commission on Radioactive Decommissioning belong to the political party holding the largest number of seats in the House of Representatives and at least one of the Representatives belong to the political party holding the 2nd largest number of seats in the House. The amendment also strikes from the bill the addition to the commission of one member representing a local advisory group on nuclear power plants and the requirement that the chair of the commission be a Legislator.

The amendment strikes from the bill the authorization for
the Department of Human Services to establish a part-time
position to provide staff support to the Advisory Commission on
Radioactive Waste and Decommissioning and strikes the allocation
for that staff. The amendment also specifies that the Maine
Yankee Atomic Power Plant shall pay \$25,000 annually to the
Department of Environmental Protection to support allocations to
the department associated with providing support to the Advisory
Commission on Radioactive Waste and Decommissioning. The
requirement for this payment ends on the date of the final
termination of Maine Yankee's operating license.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
