An Act to Amend the Charter of the Kennebunk Light and Power District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1951, c. 53, §3 is amended to read:

Sec. 3. Territorial limits. The territorial limits within which said the district may sell, distribute and furnish electricity 6 for light, heat and power to individuals, partnerships, firms and corporations shall-be-as are set forth in section--3-of--the 8 private-and-special-laws-of Private and Special Law 1903, chapter 10 131, section 3, except that said the district may, as authorized by section 4 of said-act the Act, purchase or lease the rights, properties corporation 12 privileges, and franchises of any furnishing electricity within the territory of said the town; and except that the territorial limits of the Kennebunk Light and 14 Power District shall include so much of the towns of Lyman, Wells and North Kennebunkport as are now served by the Kennebunk Light 16Department, and may include areas contiguous to those areas now served by said Kennebunk Light Department in the towns of 18 Kennebunk, Lyman, Wells and North Kennebunkport, in which at the 20 time no other public utility is furnishing electric service, if and when the Kennebunk Light and Power District shall-have has received the consent of the public-utilities -commission Public 22 Utilities Commission in accordance with the provisions of sections 3 and 4 of chapter 46 of the revised statutes of 1944 24 and all acts amendatory thereof or additional thereto. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Maine Revised Statutes, 26 Title 35-A, section 2102, consent or approval from the Public 28 Utilities Commission is not required for the Kennebunk Light and Power District to serve any customer location in the Town of Kennebunk located within the area described in Private and 30 Special Law 1903, chapter 131, section 3. 32

SUMMARY

36 This bill exempts from Public Utility Commission approval the extension of service by the Kennebunk Light and Power 38 District to certain areas in the Town of Kennebunk.
