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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

- COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 1515, L.D. 2137 Goal. It is the goal of the Legislature that children enrolled in the Medicaid program in all regions of the State have 4 the same access to dental care as children enrolled in a private dental insurance programs. 4. Annual report. By February 15, 1999 and annually thereafter, the department shall submit to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters an annual report containing information related to the progress of the department in meeting the goal 12 stated in subsection 3 and an action plan to increase access to dental care. The report must include an analysis of the progress being made in increasing access, the problems incurred within the prior year and corrective action to be taken. The action plan must consider the following strategies to increase access: nonprofit clinics; purchase of practice clinics; enhanced reimbursement for dentists serving a large number of children under the Medicaid program; and contracts with dental clinics and health centers to provide dental care.' 22 Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following: 24 FISCAL NOTE
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28 The Department of Human Services will incur some minor additional costs to improve access to dental care for children 30 under the Medicaid program. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources since the telephone 32 referral service will be provided in conjunction with department's Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis 34 Treatment efforts.

The Governor's proposed 1998-1999 supplemental budget, LD 1950, includes \$2,605,030 and \$5,424,713 in fiscal years 1997-98 and 1998-99, respectively, for a fee increase for dentists. This level of funding is provided through General Fund appropriations and Federal Expenditure Fund allocations.'

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill. It retains the provisions concerning a telephone referral service for Medicaid dental services for children and changes the report of the Department of Human Services from a one-time report to an annual report and action plan. It also adds a fiscal note.
