	Sec. 1. Study conducted. Resolved: That the Bureau of
2	Veterans' Services shall conduct a study to determine how best to solve the problems associated with the expansion of the Maine
4	Veterans' Memorial Cemetery; the demand on existing resources, particularly the timings of burials; and inadequate staffing
6	levels. The study must include an examination of the use of
8	volunteers to assist in handling the increased workload of the cemetery. As part of its study, the bureau shall also look at reallocation of existing space. The bureau shall report back to
10	the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over legal and veterans affairs by December 15,
12	1998; and be it further

Sec. 2. Land purchase. Resolved: That, when considering the purchase of land for the expansion of the Maine Veterans' Memorial Cemetery, the Director of the Bureau of Veterans' Services shall give preference to land within a 3-mile radius of the existing cemetery. If land is not available within a 3-mile radius, then the director may look elsewhere within the State; and be it further

Sec. 3. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
