An Act to Grant the Joint Standing Committee Having Jurisdiction over Criminal Matters the Authority to Review the Appointments of the Commissioner of Public Safety and the Chief of the State Police.

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 203.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §1501, first \P , as amended by PL 1975, c. 771, 4 §261, is further amended to read:

6 The Commissioner of Public Safety, with the advice and consent of the Governor and subject to review by the Jeint Standing - Committee - on - State - Government joint standing committee 8 of the Legislature having jurisdiction over criminal justice matters and to confirmation by the Legislature, shall appoint a 10 Chief of the State Police, as heretofore appointed, to serve for 12 a term of 4 years unless removed for cause. Such The appointment shall must be made from the commissioned officer ranks of the State Police. He The Chief of the State Police may be removed by 14 impeachment or by the Governor on the address of both branches of 16 the Legislature.

Sec. 2. 25 MRSA §2901, as repealed and replaced by PL 1993, c. 349, §54, is amended to read:

§2901. Department; commissioner

There is created and established the Department of Public 24 Safety to coordinate and efficiently manage the law enforcement and public safety responsibilities of the State, to consist of the Commissioner of Public Safety, in this chapter called 26 "commissioner," who is appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having 28 jurisdiction over state-and-local-gevernment criminal justice 30 matters and to confirmation by the Legislature, to serve at the pleasure of the Governor, and the following: the Bureau of State Police, the Bureau of Liquor Enforcement, the Office of the State 32 Fire Marshal, the Maine Criminal Justice Academy, the Maine Highway Safety Commission, the Bureau of Highway Safety and the 34 Maine Drug Enforcement Agency.

SUMMARY

This bill transfers the authority to review appointments of the Commissioner of Public Safety and the Chief of the State Police from the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government to the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice, which is consistent with the jurisdiction of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice over public safety matters.
