An Act to Create a Maine Children's Trust Fund Registration Plate.

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 203.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3881, sub-§3, as repealed and replaced by PL 1995, c. 402, Pt. A, §4, is amended to read:

"Fund" means the repository for funds donated to 6 3. Fund. the Maine Children's Trust Incorporated by the taxpayers of the State through an income tax checkoff pursuant to Title 36, 8 section 5285 and the Maine Children's Trust Fund registration plate income under Title 29-A, section 468, as well as federal 10 grants and contracts, privately donated funds and in-kind 12 donations for prevention programs, or by any means for the purposes of this chapter.

Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §3885, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 600, 16 Pt. A, §16, is amended to read:

5. Endowment fund. An endowment fund is established pursuant to this subsection. A minimum of 10% of tax checkoff and
registration plate revenue received each year from-individuals must be set aside for allocation to the segregated endowment
fund. Up to 90% of the tax checkoff and registration plate revenue and other income received by the endowment fund may be expended annually by the board in accordance with this chapter.

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Sec. 3. 29-A MRSA §468 is enacted to read:

28 **§468.** Maine Children's Trust Fund registration plates

 The Secretary of State shall issue Maine Children's Trust Fund registration plates, referred to in this section as
"children's trust registration plates," beginning July 1, 1999 in accordance with this section. Children's trust registration
plates are not required for registration of a motor vehicle but are authorized to allow citizens to participate voluntarily in
the Maine Children's Trust Incorporated program. A citizen may apply for children's Trust Incorporated as provided in this section.

1. Issuance of children's trust registration plates. The 42 Secretary of State, upon receiving an application and evidence of payment of the excise tax required by Title 36, the registration 44 fee required by this Title and the contribution to the Maine Children's Trust Incorporated provided for in subsection 4, shall issue a registration certificate and a set of children's trust 46 registration plates to be used in lieu of regular registration 48 plates. The Secretary of State may issue children's trust registration plates to a vehicle in any registration class if the 50 designated registration plate for that class does not preclude its use in conjunction with the children's trust registration

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plate design. The Secretary of State may issue children's trust registration plates to certain state-owned vehicles in accordance with section 517.

Plate design; optional children's trust vanity plates.
The Secretary of State, in consultation with the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human
resources matters shall determine the plate design.

10 The design must accommodate the use of numbers and letters as provided in section 453. Upon request and as provided by section 12 453, the Secretary of State shall issue children's trust registration plates that are also vanity plates. Children's 14 trust vanity plates are issued in accordance with this section and section 453. The annual service fee of \$15 for vanity plates 16 is credited to the Highway Fund.

 3. Temporary facsimile plate. The Secretary of State may issue a facsimile plate for temporary use up to a 60-day period
until the permanent plates are received. The facsimile plate must be attached to the rear plate bracket.

 4. Initial contribution to the Maine Children's Trust
24 Incorporated; renewal contribution. In addition to the regular motor vehicle registration fee prescribed by law for the
26 particular class of vehicle registered, the initial contribution for children's trust registration plates is \$20, which must be
28 deposited with the Treasurer of State and credited to the Maine Children's Trust Incorporated established in Title 22, chapter
30 1058.

32 In addition to the regular motor vehicle registration fee prescribed by law for the particular class of vehicle registered, 34 the annual renewal contribution for children's trust registration plates is \$15, which must be deposited with the Treasurer of 36 State and credited to the Maine Children's Trust Incorporated established in Title 22, chapter 1058.

 5. Reimbursement for production and issuance costs. The
40 Treasurer of State shall transfer annually from the Maine Children's Trust Incorporated to the Highway Fund \$6 for each
42 initial set of children's trust registration plates issued and \$1 for each renewal of children's trust registration plates. This
44 transfer is to reimburse the Secretary of State for costs associated with production and issuance of the plates.

 6. Proceeds from sale of products using the children's
trust registration plate design. All proceeds from the sale of products using the children's trust registration plate design
must be deposited with the Treasurer of State and credited to the Maine Children's Trust Incorporated established in Title 22,
chapter 1058.

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Sec. 4. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 1999.

SUMMARY

This bill authorizes a children's trust motor vehicle registration plate, with revenues, after administrative costs, paid to the Maine Children's Trust Incorporated for child abuse and neglect programs. Issuance of the children's trust motor vehicle registration plates begins in 1999, after the expiration of the moratorium on specialty plates contained in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29-A, section 467.

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
