20 Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 1 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §6103, sub-§4 as enacted by PL 1995, c. 24 547, §5, is amended to read:

4. Expenses. Netwithstanding Except as provided in subsections 5 and 6, and notwithstanding Title 26, sections 594
and 629, the expense of obtaining the information required by this section must be paid by the applicant.

Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §6103, sub-§§5 and 6, as enacted by PL 1997, 32 c. 452, §3, are amended to read:

34 Criminal record information obtained from the Federal 5. Bureau of Investigation. The If the department pays for the obtaining of such information, the commissioner shall obtain 36 other state and national criminal history record information from the Federal Bureau of Investigation for any person applying for 38 certification, authorization, approval or renewal. The 40 commissioner may rely on information provided by the Federal Bureau of Investigation within 24 months prior to the issuance of 42 a certificate, authorization, approval or renewal.

6. Fingerprinting. The <u>If the department pays for the</u>
<u>obtaining of such information, the</u> applicant shall submit 2
fingerprint cards bearing the legible rolled and flat impression

of the applicant's fingerprints prepared by a state or local public law enforcement agency to the department which shall forward the fingerprint cards to the Department of Public Safety, State Bureau of Identification for the purpose of conducting state and national criminal history record checks.'

Further amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering 8 any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

## SUMMARY

14 This amendment specifies that an applicant must submit to a Federal Bureau of Investigation criminal history record check and 16 fingerprinting only if the Department of Education pays the expense of the background check and fingerprinting.
