Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting 24 the following:

Further amend the bill in section 1 by striking out all of that part designated "<u>\$264.</u>" and inserting in its place the following:

32 '<u>§264. Employees</u>

34 The department may employ such personnel as it considers necessary to provide adequate oversight and enforcement and to 36 carry out the purposes of this chapter, subject to the Civil Service Law. The department may fix the compensation of the 38 employees on a per diem basis, subject to the Civil Service Law.

40 Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, all officials whose presence is regularly required at a race meet
42 must be licensed by the commission and hired on an annual basis by the licensee. The commission shall provide the list of
44 approved judges in accordance with section 279-C. The licensee may terminate the employment of a presiding or associate judge

Racing Commission within the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources of \$129,600 beginning in fiscal year 1998-99. This will also decrease General Fund revenue by \$103,600 annually beginning in fiscal year 1998-99 from the elimination of reimbursement for these costs.

The Harness Racing Promotional Board will incur some minor additional costs to report to the Legislature and to compensate 2 alternate members of the board. These costs can be absorbed within the board's existing budgeted resources.'

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## SUMMARY

This amendment strikes the entire bill, replacing it with 16 provisions for hiring and firing race track officials and a requirement that the Harness Racing Promotional Board report to 18 the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over matters of harness racing.

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The amendment also adds an appropriation and a fiscal note 22 to the bill.

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
