This amendment reduces the General Fund impact of the bill by \$2,445,282 by eliminating the requirement for a cost-of-living adjustment and removing the General Fund appropriations and Federal Expenditure Fund allocation contained in the bill.

## **SUMMARY**

This amendment removes the provision that required an increase in base pay and a 3% cost-of-living increase for certain direct care workers employed by community mental retardation services providers. It directs the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services to request supplemental funding for cost-based reimbursement or cost-of-living increase during the 2000-2001 biennium.
