2	Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §2901, sub-§8-D is enacted to read:

_	8-D. Farmstead cheese. "Farmstead cheese" means goat
6	cheese that is heat treated.
8	Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §2904-A is enacted to read:
10	\$2904-A. Farmstead cheese
12	1. Inspection. The department shall inspect the processing
	of farmstead cheese using the same standards that the department
14	uses to inspect other cheese.
16	2. Labeling: licensing standards. The department shall
10	establish rules for the labeling and licensing of farmstead
18	cheese. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine
	technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter
20	II-A.
22	3. Sale restrictions. Farmstead cheese may only be sold
	through farmers' markets and farm stands that are licensed
24	pursuant to rules adopted by the department.

_	This bill requires that the production of farmstead cheese
30	be licensed. The bill also requires the inspection and labeling
	of the cheese by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural
32	Resources. It also provides for the limited sale of the product. The bill authorizes the department to establish rules
34	for the licensing, inspection and labeling of farmstead cheese.
