Sec. 2. Office space assessment. The Commissioner of Corrections shall perform an assessment of office space needs within the Division of Probation and Parole and prioritize the need for additional space within the division. The commissioner shall determine whether additional office space is available and make recommendations for obtaining the additional office space. The commissioner shall report these recommendations to the First Regular Session of the 119th Legislature by February 1, 1999.

The commissioner shall conduct the requirements of this section to the extent possible within the existing budgeted resources of the department.

SUMMARY

This bill provides a General Fund appropriation to the Department of Corrections to increase by 25 the number of probation officers. The new probation officer positions are to be used in the following manner: Five officers are assigned to domestic violence cases; 5 officers are assigned to supervised community confinement cases; 4 officers are assigned to mental health cases; one officer is assigned to Region 1 Drug Court; and 10 officers are assigned to areas to be determined by the Commissioner of Corrections. This bill also increases by 4 the number of support staff for the Division of Probation and Parole.

This bill requires the commissioner to conduct an assessment of the office space needs for the division and to locate new space based upon the needs identified in the assessment. The commissioner is required to report the commissioner's recommendations to the Legislature.
