Sec. C-2. Lease-purchase authorized for engineering vehicles or 36 equipment. Pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1587, the Department of Transportation, Highway Fund, is 38 authorized to establish lease-purchase contracts for the procurement of engineering vehicles or equipment. The term of 40 the contracts may not be more than 7 years. The cumulative total principal value of the lease-purchase contracts may not exceed 42 \$10,000,000. The interest rate may not exceed 6% and the total interest may not exceed \$2,400,000. 44

Sec. C-3. Lease-purchase authorized for vehicles or equipment. Pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1587, the Department of Transportation, Motor Transport Service, is authorized to establish lease-purchase contracts for the procurement of vehicles or equipment. The term of the contracts may not be more than 7 years. The cumulative total

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principal value of the lease-purchase contracts may not exceed \$12,000,000. The interest rate may not exceed 6% and total interest costs may not exceed \$2,880,000.

Sec. C-4. Retiree health; lapsed balances. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, \$98,558 of unencumbered balance forward from fiscal year 1996-97 in the Highway Fund, Statewide-Retiree Health account in the Department of Administrative and Financial Services lapses to the Highway Fund in fiscal year 1997-98.

Sec. C-5. Transfer authorized. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1585 or any other provision of 12 law, for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1998 and June 30, 1999, the Commissioner of Transportation is authorized to transfer, by 14 financial order upon the recommendation of the State Budget 16 Officer and approved by the Governor, identified Personal Services Highway Fund savings to any other program or line category within the Highway Fund to cover any nonrecurring 18 program costs. The financial order must identify the specific 20 savings in Personal Services after assuming all costs for that program including collective bargaining costs. 10 This bill will result in a net decrease in Highway Fund allocations of (\$2,465,264) in fiscal year 1997-98 and a net 12 increase in Highway Fund allocations of \$1,140,724 in fiscal year 1998-99. The bill also decreases Highway Fund revenue by 14 (\$101,442) in fiscal year 1997-98 and (\$300,000) in fiscal year 1998-99. These changes will increase the projected balance in 16 the Highway Fund at the end of the 1998-1999 biennium by \$984,098.

Sections C-2 and C-3 of this bill include lease-purchase 18 authorization for certain vehicles and equipment for the 20 Department of Transportation. The cumulative total principal value of the contracts is \$22 million. The total interest may 22 not exceed \$5.32 million. Funding for these additional lease-purchases will come from existing resources within the 24 Department of Transportation's Motor Transport Services program and the Highway Maintenance program. 26

Section C-5 allows the Department of Transportation to use 28 available personal services savings to cover any nonrecurring This will program costs. result in the transfer of an 30 undetermined amount out of the personal services line. Those savings would have accrued to the Highway Fund Salary Plan 32 program.

Section C-6 authorizes a transfer of up to 75% from the balance remaining in the Highway Fund at the end of fiscal year
 1997-98, up to \$5,100,000, to the Department of Transportation's Highway and Bridge Improvement program.

Section C-7 authorizes the Secretary of State to establish Highway Fund limited-period positions within the Bureau of Motor Vehicles. The Secretary of State will fund these positions utilizing existing budgeted resources. These positions must have an end date not later than June 30, 1999.'
