38	1. Creation. The Maine First Scholars Fund, referred to in this section as the "fund," is created and established as a
40	nonlapsing fund under the jurisdiction and control of the Finance Authority of Maine.
42 44	2. Sources of money. The fund consists of:
46	A. All money appropriated or allocated for inclusion in the fund, from whatever source;
48	B. Money appropriated for or allocated to the student incentive scholarship program that would have been awarded
50	to students but for section 11662, subsection 5; and

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C. Any other money available to the Finance Authority of Maine and directed by the Finance Authority of Maine to be paid into the fund.

3. Application of the fund. Money in the fund may be applied to carry out any power of the Finance Authority of Maine
 under or in connection with section 11662 or to pay any obligations incurred in connection with the fund, except that the
 maximum aggregate amount of scholarships awarded to students attending private institutions may not exceed \$1,000,000 annually
 from funds appropriated for the Maine First Scholars Program. Money in the fund not needed currently to meet the obligations of
 the Finance Authority of Maine as provided in this chapter may be invested in any manner permitted by law.

4. Accounts within fund. The Finance Authority of Maine 18 may divide the fund into separate accounts as it determines necessary or convenient for carrying out the purposes of this 20 chapter.

22 5. Revolving fund. The fund is a nonlapsing, revolving fund. Any unexpended funds appropriated by the Legislature to 24 carry out the purposes of this program do not lapse but must be carried forward for continued use in the program.

<u>§11662. Maine First Scholars Program</u>

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 Established. The Maine First Scholars Program, referred
 to in this chapter as the "program," is established to provide students in this State with an incentive to aspire to and plan
 for pursuing their education after high school at institutions of higher education in the State. The program offers financial
 assistance to students in their first year of postsecondary education in order to reduce the deterrent effect of the cost of higher education on students' aspirations.

 2. Assistance provided to students at public institutions. The Finance Authority of Maine may provide scholarship assistance
 40 to eligible students attending the University of Maine System, the Maine Technical College System or the Maine Maritime Academy,
 42 subject to the following limitations.

A. The maximum amount of scholarship assistance to be provided by the Finance Authority of Maine to any student
 under this subsection is the lesser of the actual amount of tuition charged by the institution attended by that student
 or the amount set as tuition by the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System for the University of Maine,
 except that in the case of a scholarship to a student

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attending any of the schools of the Maine Technical College System, the difference between these 2 amounts may be paid to the Maine Technical College System to support its capacity to enroll more students.

B. The scholarship assistance may be provided only for each eligible student's first year of full-time study. Funds
must be disbursed on a semester or equivalent basis. An eligible student must maintain a minimum grade point average of 2.0 and be making satisfactory progress to receive any disbursements after the first disbursement. If a scholarship recipient's course load is reduced from full time, that recipient's grant must be prorated for the term of the recipient's enrollment.

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16 C. The Finance Authority of Maine must establish rules to prioritize available funds to eligible applicants based on 18 financial need. The Finance Authority of Maine must establish the need of a student for a grant for an academic 20 year for which the student applies. A student is considered to have financial need for purposes of this subsection if the total of the expected family contribution, together with 22 any Pell Grant established pursuant to the Higher Education 24 Act of 1965, Title IV, 20 United States Code and a Maine First Scholars grant does not exceed the cost of attendance at the institution the student attends. This subsection 26 does not require that a student receive or apply for a Pell 28 Grant but only that the amount of any Pell Grant that a student is entitled to receive must be included in 30 calculating the amount of a Maine First Scholars grant whether or not the student receives the Pell Grant. The 32 expected family contribution and the cost of attendance must be determined in accordance with section 11613. 34

D. The Finance Authority of Maine must enter into an agreement with educational institutions participating in the program that includes:

SUMMARY

18 This bill creates the Maine First Scholars Program, designed to provide an incentive for Maine high school graduates to pursue 20 higher education at institutions of higher education in the Under the program, students graduating from high school State. may receive a scholarship for their first year of attendance, 22 based on demonstrated financial need. In the case of students attending institutions in the University of Maine System, the 24 Maine Technical College System or the Maine Maritime Academy, the 26 amount of the scholarship is capped at the tuition established for the University of Maine. In the case of students attending an institution in the Maine Technical College System, the 28 difference between the amount of tuition at that institution and 30 the tuition at the University of Maine is paid to the Maine Technical College System to provide for the ability to increase enrollment. 32

34 Students attending private higher educational institutions may receive a scholarship of up to \$3,000 based on demonstrated 36 financial need. Students receiving scholarships under the Maine First Scholars Program would not be entitled to also receive 38 funds from the student incentive scholarship program. All funds that would have been awarded to students under the student 40 incentive scholarship program had the student not received a scholarship under the Maine First Scholars Program may be 42 allocated to the Maine First Scholars Program for awards to students attending private institutions of higher education.

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The bill also provides for an appropriation in the amount of \$14,000,000 to fund the Maine First Scholars Program for the upcoming school year.

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
