Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 6 (page 3, lines 1 to 9 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 6. Clearinghouse. The Maine Science and Technology Foundation, working with the Maine Development Foundation, Finance Authority of Maine, the Department of Economic Community Development, the State Planning Office, the Department of Labor, the University of Maine System, the Technical College System and the high-technology industry, shall establish a statewide clearinghouse for information and assistance to persons seeking to conduct research and development and to develop high-technology businesses in the State. The clearinghouse may include, but is not limited to, the following information and assistance: a complete inventory of existing high-technology resources; sources of federal and private financial support for research and development and assistance in grant writing; and development of technology business plans, accessing capital, obtaining legal and other professional assistance, managing business growth and marketing, the science and technology report card and information on the availability of a skilled workforce. The foundation shall submit a progress report by September 1, 1999 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over business and economic development matters on the establishment of the clearinghouse. The report may include recommendations on legislation required for full implementation of the statewide clearinghouse.'

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 7 the following:

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'Sec. 8. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

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businesses and in providing a progress report on its establishment to the Legislature. These costs can be absorbed within those agencies' existing budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment clarifies the obligations of agencies in reports to the Legislature required by the original bill. It delays the submission date for the analysis of tax incentives and a marketing plan, provides an appropriation to cover the cost of analysis and adds a fiscal note.

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
