HOUSE AMENDMENT " $\mathcal{Y}$ " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1594, L.D. 2223, Bill, "An Act to Reduce Air Pollution from Motor Vehicles and to Meet Requirements of the Federal Clean Air Act"

Amend the amendment on page 3 in subsection 2 in the 3rd line (page 3, line 8 in amendment) by striking out the following: "<u>10,001</u>" and inserting in its place the following: '<u>26,001</u>'

Further amend the amendment on page 3 by inserting after the 4th indented paragraph (page 3, line 22 in amendment) the following:

'Further amend the bill in section 9 in that part designated
"<u>\$2114.</u>" by striking out all of subsections 4 to 6 (page 3, lines 28 to 50 and page 4, lines 1 to 34 in L.D.) and inserting in their place the following:

 32 '4. Standards and procedures. The Commissioner of Environmental Protection shall establish standards and procedures
34 to implement the program. The standards and procedures must include the following:
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A. Emission opacity standards for diesel-powered motor vehicles that are consistent with emission opacity standards for diesel-powered motor vehicles recommended by an interstate association of air quality control divisions in the northeast states; 42

B. Standards and procedures, including testing methods and standards for test equipment, for safe and effective

roadside testing of diesel-powered motor vehicles that operate on public ways of the State for the purpose of enforcing compliance with emission opacity standards: C. Standards and procedures for the administration and enforcement of the program. The rules may establish reciprocity agreements with other states that recognize enforcement actions related to diesel-powered motor vehicle

D. Repair requirements and standards and procedures for certification of repairs.

5. Educational program. A person who causes operation of a diesel-powered motor vehicle that does not comply with the program's emission opacity standards must be given educational materials by the Department of Environmental Protection regarding the environmental and other benefits of a vehicle that is in compliance with the standards set forth in subsection 4.

 <u>6.</u> Implementation. The Department of Environmental
Protection shall implement the program no later than 7 days following the effective date of this section. An operator of a
diesel-powered motor vehicle that does not comply with the program's emission opacity standards is not subject to penalties.'

Further amend the bill in section 9 in that part designated 28 "<u>\$2114.</u>" by adding after the last indented paragraph a new paragraph to read:

'This section is repealed June 30, 1999.' '

Further amend the amendment by striking out section 15 and inserting in its place the following:

36 'Sec. 15. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from the Highway Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

This bill includes a Highway Fund allocation of \$185,400 in fiscal year 1998-99 for a State Police Sergeant, a State Police Trooper and general operating expenses to handle the additional motor vehicle inspection responsibilities. The estimated future costs beginning in fiscal year 1999-2000 will be approximately \$220,299 annually.

8 This bill also includes a Highway Fund allocation of \$33,500 in fiscal year 1998-99 for the Department of Environmental 10 Protection to provide a public education program, to establish a 1-year pilot program for diesel testing and to cover operational 12 costs of automobile inspection and maintenance testing. The estimated future costs will be approximately \$32,160 annually 14 beginning in fiscal year 1999-2000.

16 This bill may increase prosecutions for Class E crimes. If a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties 18 are estimated to be \$86.45 per day per prisoner. These costs are not reimbursed by the State. The number of prosecutions that may 20 result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

#### SUMMARY

This amendment changes the proposed Diesel-powered Motor Vehicle Emission Opacity Testing Program in the following ways.

1. It requires the Commissioner of Environmental Protection to establish procedures and standards to implement the program within 7 days of the effective date of the bill. As proposed in the bill, the Department of Environmental Protection is required to adopt rules.

2. It eliminates the punitive aspects of the program, instead requiring the department to give the operator of a vehicle that does not comply with the standards established in

the program educational materials describing the benefits of a vehicle that does comply with the program.

3. It repeals the program on June 30, 1999.
