14	SENATE AMENDMENT " ${\cal C}$ " to H.P. 1594, L.D. 2223, Bill, "An Act		
16	to Reduce Air Pollution from Motor Vehicles and to Meet Requirements of the Federal Clean Air Act"		
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20	Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 1 and 2 and inserting in their place the following:		
22	'Sec.1. 29-A MRSA §1751, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:		
24 26	2-A. Enhanced inspection. Beginning January 1, 1999, a motor vehicle that is required to be registered in Cumberland County and that is subject to inspection pursuant to subsection 1		
28	must have an annual enhanced inspection. The following equipment is subject to inspection:		
30	A. Equipment subject to inspection pursuant to subsection 2;		
32	B. The fuel tank cap on 1974 and subsequent models of gasoline-powered vehicles; and		
34	<u>C. The on-board diagnostic system on 1996 and subsequent</u>		
36	models.		
38	<u>A motor vehicle that is not required to be registered in Cumberland County may have an enhanced inspection under this</u>		
40	subsection.'		
42	Further amend the bill in section 3 by striking out all of paragraphs A, B and C and inserting in their place the following:		
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	'A. The fee for an inspection under subsection 2 is \$6;		

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B. From January 1, 1999 to December 31, 1999, the fee for an enhanced inspection under subsection 2-A is \$6; and

C. Beginning January 1, 2000, the fee for an enhanced inspection under subsection 2-A is \$6 for each inspection performed on pre-1996 models and \$9 for each inspection performed on 1996 and subsequent models.'

Further amend the bill in section 4 in subsection 4 by striking out the first paragraph (page 1, lines 38 and 39 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'4. Phase-in. The enhanced inspection required by subsection 2-A must be phased in as follows.'

Further amend the bill in section 5 by striking out all of subsection 6 and inserting in its place the following:

'6. Inspection standard for fuel tank cap. Notwithstanding the inspection standards of subsection 1, a fuel tank cap subject to the inspection required by section 1751, subsection 2-A, paragraph B must meet the standards in rules adopted by the Chief of the State Police. The Chief of the State Police shall adopt rules to establish procedures and standards for a fuel tank cap pressure test.'

Further amend the bill in section 5 in subsection 7 in the 4th line (page 2, line 11 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "2, paragraph Q" and inserting in its place the following: '2-A, paragraph C'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of sections 6 to 34 8 and inserting in their place the following:

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'Sec. 6. 29-A MRSA §1762, sub-§8 is enacted to read:

 38 8. Enhanced inspection stations. Beginning January 1, 1999, official inspection stations located in Cumberland County
 40 shall offer enhanced inspections pursuant to section 1751, subsection 2-A and may not offer inspections pursuant to section
 42 1751, subsection 2. Official inspection stations located outside of Cumberland County may offer inspections under section 1751,
 44 subsections 2 and 2-A. An inspection station that offers enhanced inspections shall employ an inspection mechanic
 46 certified to perform enhanced inspections.'

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Further amend the bill in section 9 in that part designated "**§2114.**" by striking out subsection 2 and inserting in its place the following:

'2. Diesel-powered motor vehicle. As used in this section, "diesel-powered motor vehicle" refers only to diesel-powered motor vehicles that have a gross vehicle weight rating of 10,001 or more pounds and that are used in commerce. "Diesel-powered motor vehicle" does not include a truck registered as a farm truck.'

Further amend the bill in section 9 in that part designated
"S2114." in subsection 3 in the last line (page 3, line 26 in
L.D.) by inserting after the following: "requirements." the
following: 'Only diesel-powered motor vehicles identified by
certified inspectors as potential violators of the program's
emission opacity standards are subject to testing under this
section, Inspectors must be certified pursuant to the procedures
for certification specified in 40 Code of Federal Regulations,
Part 60, Appendix A, Method 9.'

Further amend the bill in section 11 by striking out all of the first sentence (page 5, lines 6 to 13 in L.D.) and inserting
in its place the following: 'By January 1, 1999, the Chief of the State Police shall amend the rules regarding the certification of
inspection mechanics to ensure that all inspection mechanics certified to perform enhanced inspections are knowledgeable about
the requirements for motor vehicle inspections under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29-A, section 1751, subsection 2-A and section 1756, subsections 6 and 7.'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of sections 12 and 13 inserting in their place the following:

Sec. 12. Rulemaking; Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall adopt rules to establish a procedure for identifying 36 on a certificate of registration those vehicles required to have an enhanced inspection pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, 38 Title 29-A, section 1751, subsection 2-A. The rules may require that a certificate of registration contain a statement that a 40 vehicle is registered in Cumberland County or that a vehicle is 42 subject to enhanced inspection. These rules are routine technical rules under Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.

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Sec. 13. Public education program. The Department of Environmental Protection shall establish and implement an ongoing public education program in Cumberland County related to air quality. The education program must be designed to enhance and

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facilitate the enforcement of state traffic laws governing automobile inspection and maintenance requirements by increasing public awareness of the ozone and air toxics problems in the State related to emissions from mobile sources and promoting measures that achieve the purposes of the automobile inspection and maintenance program.

Sec. 14. Department of Transportation. The Department of Transportation shall provide assistance to the Department of Public Safety in the conduct of activities in support of implementing the state motor vehicle inspection program.

Sec. 15. Report; enhanced inspection program. The Department of Environmental Protection and the Department of Public Safety 14 shall jointly evaluate the enhanced inspection program required by this Act, including the following: the status of the program, 16 compliance with the program, enforcement of the program and air 18 quality benefits from the program. The Department of Environmental Protection and the Department of Public Safety 20 shall submit a joint report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources 22 matters by January 1, 2000 that includes the findings of the evaluation and any recommendations for expanding the enhanced 24 inspection program statewide.

Sec. 16. Report; inspection fee. The Department of Public Safety 26 shall study and report by January 15, 1999 to the joint standing 28 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters on the fee for motor vehicle inspections 30 enhanced inspections required under the Maine Revised and Title 29-A, section 1751. The department shall Statutes, 32 consider funding for implementation of the inspection program and whether the inspection fee should be market-driven or based on an 34 hourly labor rate or a flat-rate fee and whether there should be a cap on such a fee. The department shall make a recommendation 36 on whether the inspection fees established in Title 29-A, section 1751, subsection 3 should be replaced with a market-driven fee.

The joint standing committee of the Legislature having 40 jurisdiction over transportation matters may report out legislation to the First Regular Session of the 119th Legislature 42 regarding the inspection fee and funding of the inspection program.

Sec. 17. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from the Highway Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

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Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment amends the State's motor vehicle inspection 10 program to require an enhanced inspection for motor vehicles required to be registered in Cumberland County. The enhanced 12 inspection consists of an inspection of the equipment currently subject to inspection plus a fuel tank cap pressure test on model 14 1974 and later gasoline-powered vehicles, beginning January 1, 1999, and an inspection of the on-board diagnostic system on 1996 16 and later vehicles, beginning January 1, 2000. The amendment requires the State Police to adopt rules to establish procedures 18 and standards for a fuel tank cap pressure test.

The amendment retains the \$6 fee for the current inspection and sets the fee for the enhanced inspection at \$6 beginning January 1, 1999 and at \$9 beginning January 1, 2000 for 1996 and later model vehicles only. It strikes the section in the bill that increases the fee paid by inspection stations for inspection stickers from \$1 to \$1.50 and it strikes the section from the bill that credits 20ϕ of the inspection sticker fee to the General Fund.

The amendment requires all inspection stations in Cumberland County to offer the enhanced inspection only and permits inspection stations outside of Cumberland County to offer both the current inspection and the enhanced inspection. It requires an inspection station that offers enhanced inspections to employ an inspection mechanic certified to perform enhanced inspections.

36 The amendment defines "diesel-powered motor vehicle," for purposes of the diesel testing program, as a diesel-powered motor 38 vehicle that has a gross vehicle weight rating of 10,001 or more pounds and that is used in commerce. It excludes a truck 40 registered as a farm truck from the diesel testing requirements. The amendment specifies that only diesel-powered motor vehicles 42 identified by certified inspectors as potential violators of the emission opacity standards are subject to testing under the diesel testing program and requires that inspectors be certified 44 pursuant to the procedures for certification specified in the 46 United States Environmental Protection Agency's Reference Method 9. 48

The amendment requires the Department of Environmental 50 Protection to implement a public education program in Cumberland

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County designed to enhance and facilitate the enforcement of 2 state traffic laws automobile inspection governing and maintenance requirements. It requires the Department of 4 Environmental Protection and the Department of Public Safety to report jointly to the joint standing committee of the Legislature б having jurisdiction over natural resources matters by January 1, 2000 regarding an evaluation of the enhanced inspection program 8 and any recommendations for expanding the enhanced inspection It also requires the Department of Public program statewide. Safety to report to the joint standing committee of the 10 Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters on 12 issues related to market pricing of motor vehicle inspections and enhanced inspections.

The amendment allocates from the Highway Fund \$50,000 to the State Police to implement the motor vehicle inspection program. These funds will be used to match federal congestion mitigation and air quality funds that will be used to provide equipment to official inspection stations in Cumberland County to perform the fuel tank cap pressure test.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
