Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

This bill may reduce the amount that otherwise will be transferred to the Maine Rainy Day Fund at the close of fiscal year 1997-98. The impact on the Retirement Allowance Fund, State Contingent Account, Maine Economic Improvement Strategy, Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital, FAME Loan Insurance Reserve or any other required year end transfers can not be determined at this time.

Funding certain environmental cleanup programs with surplus fiscal year 1997-98 surplus General Fund revenues rather than through general obligation bonds will reduce the overall costs to State Government as future debt service costs will be avoided.'

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill that authorized a bond issue of \$15,000,000. It instead requires the State Controller to transfer the first \$7,000,000 of General Fund revenue surplus at the close of fiscal year 1997-98 to the Department of Environmental Protection and the Department of Human Services to be used for certain environmental clean-up programs. The \$7,000,000 transferred is to be deducted from the amount that would otherwise be first transferred to the Maine Rainy Day Fund.
