An Act to Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue in the Amount of \$16,000,000 to Construct Water Pollution Control Facilities; to Close and Clean Up Municipal Solid Waste Landfills; to Clean Up Tire Stockpiles; to Investigate, Abate, Clean Up and Mitigate Hazardous Substance Discharges; to Mitigate Storm Water Pollution through a Comprehensive Watershed Protection Program; and to Make Drinking Water System Improvements.

Preamble. Two thirds of both Houses of the Legislature deeming it necessary in accordance with the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 14, to authorize the issuance of bonds on behalf of the State of Maine to provide funds to construct water pollution control facilities; to close and clean municipal solid waste landfills; to clean up tire stockpiles; to investigate, abate, clean up and mitigate hazardous substance discharges; to mitigate storm water pollution through comprehensive watershed protection program and to make drinking water system improvements.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Authorization of bonds to provide funds to construct water pollution control facilities; to close and clean up municipal solid waste landfills; to clean up tire stockpiles; to investigate, abate, clean up and mitigate hazardous substance discharges; to mitigate storm water pollution through a comprehensive watershed protection program; and to make drinking water system improvements. The Treasurer of State is authorized, under the direction of the Governor, to issue bonds in the name and on behalf of the State in an amount not exceeding \$16,000,000 to raise funds to construct water pollution control to close and clean up municipal landfills; to clean up tire stockpiles; to investigate, abate, clean up and mitigate hazardous substance discharges; to mitigate comprehensive pollution through a watershed water protection program; and to make drinking water improvements as authorized by section 6. The bonds are a pledge of the full faith and credit of the State. The bonds may not run for a period longer than 10 years from the date of the original issue of the bonds. At the discretion of the Treasurer of State, with the approval of the Governor, any issuance of bonds may contain a call feature.

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Sec. 2. Records of bonds issued to be kept by the Treasurer of State. The Treasurer of State shall keep an account of each bond showing the number of the bond, the name of the successful bidder to whom sold, the amount received for the bond, the date of sale and the date when payable.

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Sec. 3. Sale; how negotiated; proceeds appropriated. The Treasurer of State may negotiate the sale of the bonds by direction of the Governor, but no bond may be loaned, pledged or hypothecated on behalf of the State. The proceeds of the sale of the bonds, which must be held by the Treasurer of State and paid by the Treasurer of State upon warrants drawn by the State Controller, are appropriated solely for the purposes set forth in this Act. Any unencumbered balances remaining at the completion of the project in section 6 lapse to the debt service account established for the retirement of these bonds.

Sec. 7. Contingent upon ratification of bond issue. Sections 1 to 6 do not become effective unless the people of the State have 2 ratified the issuance of bonds as set forth in this Act. Sec. 8. Appropriation balances at year-end. At the end of each 6 fiscal year, all unencumbered appropriation balances representing state money carry forward. Bond proceeds that have not been 8 expended within 10 years after the date of the sale of the bonds lapse to General Fund debt service. 10 Sec. 9. Bonds authorized but not issued. Any bonds authorized but not issued, or for which bond anticipation notes are not 12 issued within 5 years of ratification of this Act, deauthorized and may not be issued; except that the Legislature 14 may, within 2 years after the expiration of that 5-year period, extend the period for issuing any remaining unissued bonds or 16 bond anticipation notes for an additional amount of time not to 18 exceed 5 years. Sec. 10. Referendum for ratification; submission at general election; 20 form of question; effective date. This Act must be submitted to the legal voters of the State of Maine at the next general election 22 in the month of November following passage of this Act. 24 municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a general election, to vote 26 on the acceptance or rejection of this Act by voting on the 28 following question: 30 "Do you favor a \$16,000,000 bond issue for the following purposes: 32 \$6,000,000 to construct water pollution facilities, providing the state match for \$10,000,000 in 34 federal funds; 36 \$3,500,000 to protect the State's drinking water 38 resources by granting funds to cities and towns for the closure and cleanup of their solid waste landfills; 40 \$1,500,000 to protect the public health and safety and 42 the environment by providing funds for the cleanup of tire stockpiles; 44
