A person who meets the requirements of this paragraph may
apply to the Lobster Advisory Council for a Class I, Class
II or Class III lobster and crab fishing license. The
Lobster Advisory Council may grant a Class I, Class II or
Class III lobster and crab fishing license to a person who
qualifies under this paragraph. A person attempting to
qualify pursuant to subparagraph (2) shall provide the
Lobster Advisory Council with a notarized letter from the
person who held the Class II or Class III license issued
under section 6421 as a sternman. A person who provides a
false report commits a Class D crime. This paragraph is
repealed December 31, 1998.

This amendment adds another exception to the moratorium on commercial lobster and crab fishing licenses. This amendment allows the Lobster Advisory Council to grant a Class I, Class II or Class III lobster and crab fishing license to a person who was licensed as such in 1993, 1994, 1995 or 1996 but who was not licensed as such in 1997 due to enumerated reasons.
