	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the
2	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
4	Whereas, the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5,
6	chapter 375, subchapter II-A, requires legislative authorization before major substantive agency rules may be finally adopted by
8	the agency; and
10	Whereas, the above named major substantive rule has been submitted to the Legislature for review; and
12	Whereas, immediate enactment of this resolve is necessary to
14	record the Legislature's position on final adoption of the rule; and
16	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
18	create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
20	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it
22	Sec. 1. Adoption. Resolved: That final adoption of Chapter
24	113: Regulations Governing the Licensing and Functioning of Assisted Living Facilities, a provisionally adopted major
26	substantive rule of the Department of Human Services, and submitted to the Legislature for review pursuant to the Maine
28	Administrative Procedure Act, is authorized.
