An Act to Implement the Recommendations of the Majority of the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities and Energy Arising from Its Government Evaluation Act Review of the Office of the Public Advocate.

(EMERGENCY)

Reported by the Majority from the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities and Energy pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 955, subsection 4.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Office of the Public Advocate needs immediate supplemental funding to support its current case load and obligations; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from 18 Other Special Revenue to carry out the purposes of this Act.

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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

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SUMMARY

This bill provides supplemental funding to the Office of the 6 Public Advocate to fund salary increases for the Public Advocate and the Public Advocate's staff and to cover costs of consultants 8 and expert witnesses to handle cases at the Public Utilities Commission involving electric industry restructuring and telephone utility regulation and at the Public Utilities 10 Commission and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission involving Maine Yankee Nuclear 12 issues related to Power Plant decommissioning.

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
