46	Sec. 3. Agricultural marketing. During the First Regular Session of the 119th Legislature, the Commissioner of
48	Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources shall submit a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having
50	jurisdiction over agricultural matters and to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over economic and

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community development matters regarding agricultural marketing initiatives. The report must describe enhanced services to agricultural producers and promotion of agricultural products attributable to funding provided in this Act. Upon receipt of the report, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agricultural matters shall review the operations of the Division of Market and Production Development within the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources and shall make a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs regarding staffing and operations of the department.

Sec. 4. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

SUMMARY

This bill implements the recommendations of the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry 4 relating to its review of the Department of Agriculture, Food and б Rural Resources under the State Government Evaluation Act. It eliminates the designation of 5 management positions within the 8 Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources as major policy-influencing positions. It appropriates funds to the 10 Division of Market and Production Development, within the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, to enhance services to Maine's agricultural producers and to promote Maine 12 agricultural products.

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
