18	Amend the bill by inserting after the enacting clause the following:

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## SENATE AMENDMENT

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Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

## FISCAL NOTE

The exemption from licensure of certain electric utility 10 employees will result in insignificant reductions of dedicated revenue to the Board of Boiler Rules and the Oil and Solid Fuel 12 Board within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation from license fees.

## SUMMARY

Electric utility employees working in generation facilities owned by the electric utilities are currently exempt from certain occupational licensing requirements. Under current law, electric utilities are required to divest these generation facilities. This amendment would provide for temporary exemptions from the licensing requirements for these utility employees who are hired by the buyers of these generation facilities and who continue to work in generation facilities. These exemptions are repealed on March 1, 2000.
