	'ORDERED, the Senate concurring, that the Joint Select
24	Committee on School-based Health Care Services is established as follows.
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	1. Committee established. The Joint Select Committee on
28	School-based Health Care Services, referred to in this order as the "committee," is established.
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	2. Membership. The committee consists of 5 members
32	appointed as follows:
34	A. Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate; and
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	B. Three members of the House of Representatives appointed
38	by the Speaker of the House.
40	3. Chairs. The first Senate member named is the Senate chair and the first House member named is the House chair.
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	4. Appointments; convening of committee. All appointments
44	must be made no later than 30 days following passage of this order. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive
46	Director of the Legislative Council upon making their appointments. When appointment of all members is complete, the

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chairs of the committee shall call and convene the first meeting of the committee no later than June 30, 2000.

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5. Duties. The committee shall:

б λ. Review the current funding sources for school-based health care services in the State, including the ability of school-based health centers to receive reimbursement for 8 their services from 3rd-party payors;

Examine the social and financial impact and the medical в. 12 efficacy of mandating insurance coverage for school-based health care services with the technical assistance of the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Bureau 14 of Insurance:

c. Examine the administrative costs and burdens to 18 school-based health centers regarding billing of public payors and 3rd-party payors for their services; 20

Review the credentialing and other requirements imposed D. 22 on health care providers and practitioners that relate to the ability of school-based health centers and practitioners in school-based health centers to bill 3rd-party payors or 24 public payors for their services;

Ε. Recommend strategies for funding school-based health 28 care services, including methods for public funding and reimbursement for school-based health care 3rd-party 30 services; and

Invite the participation of experts and interested 32 F. including the Department of Professional and parties, 34 Financial Regulation, Bureau of Insurance; the Department of Education; and the Department of Human Services, Bureau of 36 Health.

38 Staff assistance. Upon approval of the Legislative 6. Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide 40 necessary staffing services to the committee.

42 7. Compensation. Members of the committee are entitled to receive the legislative per diem as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2 and reimbursement for travel and 44 other necessary expenses for attendance at authorized meetings of 46 the committee.

8. Meetings. The committee shall hold 5 meetings, but, if 48 the committee requires additional meetings, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may approve additional meetings. 50

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SENATE AMENDMENT

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2 Report. The committee shall submit a report along with 9. any recommended legislation to the Legislature by December 1, 2000. If the committee requires an extension of time to make its 4 report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant 6 the extension.

Committee budget. The chairs of the committee, with 8 10. assistance from the committee staff, shall administer the committee's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the 10 committee shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The committee may not 12 incur expenses that would result in the committee's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the committee, the Executive 14 Director of the Legislative Council or the executive director's 16 designee shall provide the committee chairs and staff with a status report on the committee budget, expenditures incurred and 18 paid and available funds.'

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the joint order. The amendment also changes the date at which the Joint Select Committee on School-based Health Care Services must convene from May 15, 2000 26 to June 30, 2000. It also clarifies that members are compensated for their attendance only at authorized meetings of the committee. 28
