HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 30, L.D. 39, Bill, "An Act to Increase the Deer Hunting Day by 15 Minutes"


Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 6 in the last line (page 1, line 9 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "deer." the following: 'For purposes of this subsection, notwithstanding section 7001, subsection 35, "sunset" must be defined by zones within the State by rules adopted by the commissioner. Rules adopted defining "sunset" pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.'

FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife will incur some minor additional costs to adopt certain rules pertaining to the definition of sunset for different zones across the state. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.

SUMMARY

The purpose of this amendment is to address the fact that sunset occurs at different times within the State. This amendment requires that, for purposes of the provision governing twilight hunting, the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife adopt rules defining "sunset" by zones within the State.
