

2           **Sec. 1. Reimbursement of State's share of salt and sand facilities**  
3           **construction costs. Resolved:** That, notwithstanding the Maine  
4           Revised Statutes, Title 23, section 1851 requiring reimbursements  
5           to be made based on a schedule established by the Department of  
6           Environmental Protection, the State shall reimburse, in  
7           accordance with Title 23, chapter 13, subchapter VII, those  
8           municipalities that have constructed, prior to January 1, 1999,  
9           salt and sand storage facilities that were approved by the  
10          Department of Transportation. Reimbursement must be made no  
11          later than December 31, 1999.

14           This resolve requires the State to reimburse to  
15           municipalities, by December 31, 1999, the State's share of the  
16           costs of salt and sand storage facilities that were constructed  
17           by municipalities and approved by the Department of  
18           Transportation prior to January 1, 1999.
