38	SUMMARY
50	Current law calls for the Maine HIV Advisory Committee to
40	consist of 36 members, drawn from 31 different constituencies. This bill reduces the committee to a more manageable 9 members,
42	serving for 2-year, rather than the present 3-year, terms. Members would be appointed by the Governor, the President of the
44	Senate and the Speaker of the House based upon knowledge and experience, rather than constituency. The mission and duties of
46	the committee are unchanged.
