20	related costs in fiscal year 2001-02 and thereafter is estimated to be approximately \$753,000.
22	The Judicial Department may require additional General Fund
24	appropriations to cover indigent defense costs resulting from an increase in probation revocation cases in Superior Court and
26	District Court. The amounts can not be estimated at this time. The additional workload and administrative costs associated with
28	the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial
30	Department. The collection of additional fines may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'
