22	Amend the resolve by striking out the title and substituting
24	the following:
26 28	'Resolve, to Study Standardized Periods of Military Service and Other Matters Related to the Award of State of Maine Veterans' Benefits'
30 32	Further amend the resolve by striking out everything after the title and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:
34	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the
36	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
38	Whereas, there exist numerous state laws that provide for
40	veterans' benefits that are separately administered by several different state departments and agencies; and
42	Whereas, these laws recognize varying periods of service for eligibility to receive veterans' benefits; and
44	Whereas, these nonstandardized periods of service may
46	prohibit certain veterans from receiving certain benefits under state law; and
48	Whereas, these nonstandardized periods of service have made
50	the administering of veterans' benefits to Maine veterans both inconsistent and confusing, particularly when the periods of

service conflict with eligibility requirements under federal law; and

Whereas, several matters concerning the burial of veterans, veterans' property tax exemptions, the maintenance of veterans'
 gravesites, and the types and extent of medical services offered to veterans and their families, among other issues, have been
 presented to the 119th Legislature; and

10 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 12 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 14 safety; now, therefore, be it

 Sec. 1. Committee established. Resolved: That the Committee to Study Standardized Periods of Military Service and Other Matters
 Related to the Award of State of Maine Veterans' Benefits, referred to in this resolve as the "committee," is established;
 and be it further

Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the committee consists of the following 13 members:

 Two members of the Senate who also serve as members of
 the Joint Standing Committee on Legal and Veterans Affairs, appointed by the President of the Senate;
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Three members of the House of Representatives who also
 serve as members of the Joint Standing Committee on Legal and
 Veterans Affairs, appointed by the Speaker of the House of
 Representatives; and

34 3. Eight members who represent the joint standing committees listed in paragraphs A to E. The 8 committee members 36 must be drawn equally from both Houses of the Legislature and from the 2 major political parties. The President of the Senate 38 and the Speaker of the House shall appoint from their respective Houses committee members who represent the following committees:

- A. The Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human
   42 Services;
- 44 B. The Joint Standing Committee on Labor;
- C. The Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government;
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D. The Joint Standing Committee on Taxation; and

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E. The Joint Standing Committee on Transportation; and be it further

4 Sec. 3. Appointment. Resolved: That appointments must be made within 30 days of the effective date of this resolve. The 6 appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon making the appointments; and be it 8 further

Sec. 4. Chair. Resolved: That the first named Senate member is the Senate chair and the first named House of Representatives member is the House chair; and be it further

Sec. 5. Meetings and Working Groups. Resolved: 14 That the cochairs of the committee shall call and convene the first meeting of the committee within 30 days of the date that the last 16 member is appointed. The committee cochairs may form advisory groups from among 18 affected agencies, working veterans organizations the public to help carry out its and 20 responsibilities; and be it further

22 Sec. 6. Compensation. Resolved: That the committee members and entitled to receive the legislative per diem are reimbursement of necessary expenses for their attendance at 24 authorized meetings of the committee. Working group members not otherwise compensated for expenses by their employers or other 26 they represent are entitled to entities whom receive reimbursement of necessary expenses to attend authorized working 28 group meetings; and be it further

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Sec. 7. Staff. Resolved: That upon approval of the Legislative Council the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the committee; and be it further

Sec. 8. Duties. Resolved: That the committee shall study the 36 laws of this State that relate to the award of state veterans' benefits and consider alternatives that will codify and 38 standardize the present laws related to eligibility for benefits based on periods of military service. In examining these issues, 40 the committee shall consider all laws of the State that relate to veterans' benefits, including, but not limited to, those administered by the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency 42 Management, the Department of Labor, the Department of Human 44 Services and the Maine State Retirement System. As part of its study, the committee shall: 46

1. Hold public hearings to gather public comment on 48 veterans' benefit issues. At least one public hearing must be

held in each principal region of the State (north, central and south) as determined by the committee chairs;

2. Review and assess all existing laws of the State that contain eligibility criteria for veterans' benefits based on
periods of military service, including, but not limited to, laws related to the veterans' property tax exemption, medical care for
veterans and their families and veterans' burial. The review and assessment must include the identification of discrepancies and
inconsistencies in eligibility criteria based on periods of military service, among other criteria;

3. Identify and assess differences among state and federal laws regarding veterans' benefits eligibility criteria;

 Identify and consider alternatives for codifying and standardizing laws regarding eligibility criteria for veterans'
 benefits based on periods of military service, including eligibility issues as related to peacetime veterans; and

5. Recommend appropriate legislation to reflect the 22 findings of the committee; and be it further

24 Sec. 9. Report. Resolved: That the committee shall submit a report that must include its findings, together with any 26 recommended legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 119th State Legislature by December 15, 1999; and be it further 28

Sec. 10. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

22 additional General Fund This resolve includes an appropriation of \$12,590 in fiscal year 1999-00 for the Legislature for the per diem and expenses of legislative members 24 and the expenses of other eligible members of the Committee to 26 Study Standardized Periods of Military Service and Other Matters Related to the Award of State of Maine Veterans' Benefits, costs to hold 3 public hearings and to print the required report. 28

30 The additional costs associated with providing staffing assistance to the committee during the interim between 32 legislative sessions can be absorbed by the Legislature utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

**SUMMARY** 

In addition to changing the title of the resolve, the 38 amendment establishes the Committee to Study Standardized Periods of Military Service and Other Matters Related to the Award of 40 State of Maine Veterans' Benefits, alters the membership of the committee, changes the process of selecting cochairs and 42 specifically adds the veterans' property tax exemption, veterans' burial eligibility and peacetime veterans' eligibility for 44 benefits to the issues that are to be examined by the committee. It also requires the committee to hold public hearings to gather 46 public comment on veterans' benefit issues. The amendment also adds an appropriations section and a fiscal note.
