An Act to Change Eligibility for the Elderly Low Cost Drug Program.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §6162-A, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1997, c. 643, Pt. RR, §6, is further amended to read:

6 2. Income. Eligibility for this program is determined by the same income levels as eligibility for elderly households is 8 determined under chapter 907, except that individuals are also eligible for this program if the household spends at least 40% of 10 unreimbursed---direct---medical---expenses---for its income on preseription-drugs health care and the household income is not 12 more than 25% higher than the levels specified in chapter 907. For the purposes of this subsection, the costs cost of drugs 14 health care provided to a household under this chapter is considered a cost spent by the household for eligibility 16 determination purposes.

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SUMMARY

This bill expands eligibility for the elderly low cost drug 22 program to include individuals when at least 40% of the household income is spent on health care and the household income is not 24 more than 25% above current levels.
