	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
	as emergencies; and
4	Whereas, the Great Northern Paper, Inc. mill in Millinocket
6	is a great resource to the economy of Maine and the citizens in
	and around the Town of Millinocket; and

	Whereas, Private and Special Law 1997, chapter 71 separates
10	the electricity rights from the assets of the Millinocket mill; and

1.4	Whereas, the Millinocket mill is currently up for sale; and
14	Whoreas the electricity winter would be a reducible asset to
16	Whereas, the electricity rights would be a valuable asset to the mill for prospective purchasers; and
18	Whereas, Bowater Incorporated, the parent company of Great
	Northern Paper, Inc., has stated that it will close the
20	Millinocket mill in 18 months if there are no purchasers; and
22	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
2.2	create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
24	Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and

28	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
30	Sec. 1. P&SL 1997, c. 71 is repealed.
32	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
	preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

38	This bill repeals the law that allows Great Northern Paper,
	Inc. to continue to furnish electricity to and from its
40	Millinocket facilities without being considered an electric utility.
