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The Department of Corrections will incur some minor additional costs to estimate the amount necessary to fully fund the County Jail Prisoner Support and Community Corrections Fund at current levels based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and to submit an analysis and statement for inclusion in the state budget document.

The additional costs associated with submitting a report to the Legislature if the Governor's budget recommendations do not provide for full funding of the County Jail Prisoner Support and Community Corrections Fund can be absorbed by the Department of Administrative and Financial Services utilizing existing budgeted resources.

The estimated General Fund appropriations required to fund the CPI adjustment over the Governor's proposed 2000-01 funding level beginning in fiscal year 2001-02 and to change the base year for distributing funds to the counties beginning in fiscal year 2002-03 from fiscal year 1996-97 to fiscal year 1997-98 is \$145,404 and \$1,541,889 in fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03, respectively.'

SUMMARY

This amendment directs the Department of Corrections, beginning July 1, 2002 and annually thereafter, to distribute the County Jail Prisoner Support and Community Corrections Fund to counties based on the percent distribution of actual funds reimbursed to counties pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, former Title 34-A, section 1210 in fiscal year 1997-98. The amendment clarifies that each county's community corrections program account is nonlapsing. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
