The bill requires that, by June 1, 2000, every state agency, 16 department, board, commission, institution, authority or public instrumentality that requires information filing from businesses 18 or the public must have the "filing forms" available for downloading from the Internet. This requirement will necessitate 20 additional expenditures by several state departments and agencies that have substantial filings from businesses. Some of the most 22 severely impacted agencies include Maine Revenue Services, the Office of the Secretary of State, the Department of Human 24 Services and the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation The amount of the additional and Substance Abuse Services. 26 funding required by departments and agencies to meet the June 1, 2000 deadline can not be determined at this time.

It is important to note that many agencies are working 30 toward the objective stated in this bill. The impact on state agencies, departments, boards, commissions, institutions, 32 authorities or public instrumentalities does not include building the capacity to have businesses and the public complete their 34 filings via the Internet.

36 This bill includes General Fund appropriations of \$280,085 and \$302,895 and Federal Expenditures Fund allocations of 38 \$550,165 and \$593,775 in fiscal years 1999-00 and 2000-01, respectively, for the Department of Human Services to fund the 40 additional costs associated with provision of the bill that prohibits state agencies from reducing reimbursement rates for 42 electronically submitted claims.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the original bill. All state entities that require the filing of information by businesses or the public are required to have filing forms available to download from the Internet by June 1, 2000. By December 1, 2000,

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those state entities must submit an inventory of their required
form filings and a plan indicating when those form filings will be accepted electronically. This amendment also makes clear that
state entities may not charge a fee for electronically filing a claim. This amendment also adds an allocation, an appropriation
and a fiscal note to the bill.

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
