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FISCAL NOTE

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Significant amounts of additional funding will need to be included in the Governor's 2002-2003 biennial budget to provide funding for the cost of a citizen's compliance with all "mandates for personal safety." The amounts can not be determined at this time and will depend on the number of individual citizens seeking reimbursement for these types of mandates.'

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12 SUMMARY

This amendment requires the Governor to include in the budget provisions for the reimbursement to citizens of costs for compliance with personal safety mandates. This amendment adds a fiscal note to the resolution.

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
