6	§4703. Instruction for gifted and talented students in accordance with chapter 311.

10	Elementary and secondary schools may shall employ a teacher to provide special instruction for gifted and talented students.
12	Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §8104, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1997, c. 696, §5, is further amended to read:

	1. Establishment. Each school administrative unit must,
16	commencing with the 1987-88 school year, establish a plan for phasing in gifted and talented educational programs. A school
18	administrative unit or part of a school administrative unit is not required to comply with the provisions of its plan during the
20	school years beginning in the fall of 1998 and-1999.

24	This bill requires schools to employ a teacher to offer

26	eliminates the postponement of a school administrative unit's plan to provide for a gifted and talented educational program
