This amendment replaces and retitles the bill and is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice. This amendment repeals the existing requirement that a candidate for sheriff qualify for an executive certificate under the Maine Criminal Justice Academy standards and instead requires a candidate to hold current certification in basic law enforcement training under the Maine Criminal Justice Academy standards and to have at least 5 years of experience as a law enforcement officer. The amendment also repeals the grandfather provision after current terms of office are served and requires all who wish to be candidates for reelection to meet the new requirements.
