	infected with HIV and the person intentionally, knowingly, recklessly or with criminal negligence transmits HIV to another
	person.

	SUMMARY
	This bill makes the transmission of HIV a crime. A person
	who knows or has reason to believe that the person is infected
	with HIV commits a Class A crime if that person transmits HIV to
	another person intentionally, knowingly, recklessly or with
	criminal negligence.
