2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §6006-F, sub-§9** is enacted to read:

6 9. Loss of accreditation. Notwithstanding subsections 3 to  
8 6, for school year 1999-2000, the bank shall make available  
10 \$80,000,000 in grants for construction, repair and renovation of  
12 schools that have lost their accreditation based on inadequacies  
14 or defects in the physical state of the schools.

16 **Sec. 2. Appropriation.** The following funds are appropriated  
18 from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

This bill appropriates funds to be distributed as grants by  
the Maine Municipal Bond Bank to schools that have lost their  
accreditation due to the inadequacies or defects in the physical  
state of the schools.
