4	Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §2003-B is enacted to read:
б	§2003-B. Transporting an open container of liquor
8	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the
10	following meanings.
12	A. "Liquor" means and includes any alcoholic, spirituous, vinous or fermented beverage or other alcoholic beverage, or
14	combination of liquors and mixed liquors, intended for human consumption, which contains more than 1/2 of 1% alcohol by
16	volume.
18	B. "Open container" means not having a cap, stopper or other cover in place.

22	C. "Vehicle" means every vehicle that is self-propelled and designed for carrying persons or property or that is used for the transportation of persons.

26	2. Crime. A person is guilty of transporting an open container if the person:
28	A. Transports an open container of liquor in a vehicle on a public way.

32	3. Evidence. The possession of an open container of liquor in a vehicle is prima facie evidence of a violation of this section.

36	4. Violation. Violation of this section is a Class E crime.

40	This bill prohibits the transport of an open container of liquor by vehicle.
