COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 157, L.D. 219, Bill, "An Act to Require On-duty Government Employees to Wear the Same Orange Clothing as Hunters When in the Woods during Deer Season"

Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "\$7058." in the first paragraph in the 2nd and 3rd lines (page 1, lines 7 and 8 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "and other law enforcement officers under this chapter" and in the last line (page 1, line 11 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "subsection 12." the following: 'This section does not apply to military personnel or law enforcement personnel while on duty.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Conservation will incur some minor additional costs to purchase hunter orange colored clothing. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. This amendment exempts military personnel and police from the requirement to wear hunter orange while on duty. It also adds a fiscal note.
