24	Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "§7058." in the first paragraph in the 2nd and 3rd lines (page 1, lines 7 and 8 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "and other law
26	enforcement officers under this chapter" and in the last line
28	(page 1, line 11 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "subsection 12." the following: 'This section does not apply to
30	military personnel or law enforcement personnel while on duty.'
32	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

38	The Department of Conservation will incur some minor additional costs to purchase hunter orange colored clothing. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing

46	This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. This amendment
48	exempts military personnel and police from the requirement to wear hunter orange while on duty. It also adds a fiscal note.
