HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 162, L.D. 224, Bill, "An Act to Prohibit the Taking of Another Person's Legal Identification"

Amend the amendment in section 1 in that part designated "~~§153-A.~~" in the last line (page 1, line 40 in amendment) by inserting after the following: "~~905-A.~~" the following: 'The defense may be raised only by the person whose identification was misused.'

SUMMARY

This amendment clarifies that the defense to a civil action for damages arising from the misuse of identification may be raised only by the person whose identification was misused.
